This list is intended to assist ordering physicians in providing ICD-10 Diagnosis Codes as required by Medicare and other Insurers. It includes the most commonly found out-patient diagnoses (generally without complications), but is not complete. This list was compiled from the ICD-10-CM 2015, as well as the Medicare Regulations and Manuals issued or authorized by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services. An ICD-10-CM book should be used as a complete reference. The ultimate responsibility for correct coding belongs to the ordering physician.
